


Inmarsat and Corporate Jet Investor (CJI) recently surveyed business aviation professionals about their thoughts on industry trends over the next year and beyond.


There is a risk that the current long lead times in business aviation make it less attractive and may reduce the number of entrants 50% felt that in the future, many would go on to buy used private jets
